 - New Coondle-Nunile Facility Targeting early December move in by Brigade.
 - Morangup Co-location Centre upgrades commenced.
- Reminder to Brigades to do Turnout, Arrival, stand-down and back on Station messages to 6IP.
- Mitigation Activity Fund expecting announcement of grant funding soon.
- Arc Infrastructure Maintenance of Rail corridor thought town to commence early Nov.
- Bindoon Army Camp pre-season meeting attended by CESM and CBFCO. Standing offer from range operators for familiarisation drive CESM to action.

6. UPDATES AND REPORTS

6.1 Brigade Roundtable discussion and reporting

N Griggs (**Coondle-Nunile BFB**) – Concern re: Bush Fires Act 1954 Infringement Values being so low. Asked if permit referrals to Captain/FCO for comment.

H Bohlen (**Julimar BFB**) – Community Engagement resulted in 3 x New FF. Noted some inexperience amongst crew.

J Hansen (**BRMPC**) – Mitigation Activity Funding expected in around 10 days.

I MacGregor (**Toodyay VFRS**) – Two new members.

B Rigby (Bejoording BFB) – Two new members.

M McKeown (**Toodyay Central BFB**) – 45 people at community engagement street meet. 3 x new members. Highlighted bushfire venerability posed by Shingle roof at Goal Museum.

J Venn (**Morangup BFB**) – Requested map of hydrants in Townsite. CESM Comment: Water Corp are currently part way thought their hydrant infill program – new maps to be provided when their datasets updated. Enquired about access to online permit Map.

CESM Comment: This is currently limited to FCOs for privacy reasons, though works on this area of the system are planned over summer and a simplified view will be investigated. Asked if more verge mitigation would be conducted in Morangup. CESM Comment: These works form part of the MAF grant application currently with DFES.

CBFCO – As per email content included below:

- 1. I would like to thank all brigades for turnouts so far, and also thank those brigades that have performed hazard reduction burns, off their own back or on behalf of landowners.
 - All burns appear to have been conducted in a professional manner, and we haven't had any smoulder carry over; not yet anyway!!!
- 2. Thank you for showing the profile of volunteer firefighting isn't just response, and especially in your own time.
 - Thank you for efforts in support of "fire chat". There was a moderate response by citizens, but, again in your own time, and promoting self-reliance.
- 3. Thanks to issuing officers for the admin of the permit system. The new self-serve system is tweaked a bit more each year and seems to be working well, however there's still an input of time and follow up by issuing officers to check info and understand capability of applicant.

- 4. Thanks to the landowners this year who, it would appear conducted most burns without having to be rescued by volunteer turnout!!!
- 5. Thanks to Rob, CESM, for a big year in pushing through the great new station complexes we will have and the ongoing funding and planning applications for future support of emergency services in our district, for Future proofing, mitigation and education, let alone operations.
 - It may be a paid job, but there is an awful lot of time, coordination and dealing with stonewalling from various authorities, to enable projects to happen. There are no "free kicks", because it's emergency services!
- Our brigades and personnel appear to be in a good place at the moment, there will still be some tough days to provide midweek turnouts, but that is no different to many rural shires.
- 7. New appliances, new stations and the stability of leadership and brigade members is a credit to you, and should keep a very positive atmosphere around our volunteer services.
- 8. General Business:

I'd like to propose that each FCO is issued with a burn over blanket, as they at times can and will be exposed to the same possible risk of being caught, in burn over as any other appliance, particularly if tasked with sector command roles or at early arrival situation checking.

It is a bare minimum protective measure, given our response vehicle is our private vehicle.

Action: CESM investigating options.
