*Excerpts from photocopied version of the **Lloyd Family** working diary commencing September 29<sup>th</sup>, 1905, ending April 1915.*


*This transcript comes from a photocopy that was handed to the Old Gaol Museum in 2002 by Oriel Lloyd.*

*As stated in a letter to Mr Lloyd by the curator of the day, Ms Carol Littlefair, "the journal is a fascinating account of Toodyay life as it was in the early part of the twentieth century; the information is historically valuable both locally and in the wider context of farming practice in WA."*

*For the purpose of this transcription dates have been arranged in chronological order.*

*Comments by the transcriber have been italicised and placed in brackets. Bracketed question marks denote a part or section that is illegible for transcription; therefore the text has either been left out, or included to the best of the transcribers' ability.*

*(Hassell is mentioned as plastering – no mention of what – and Mr Beardman is there too, again no details, but he's charged for a series of meals.)*

*(Left hand column truncated – no dates, but Mann mentioned off work several times and gave notice on March 19<sup>th</sup>. However, April 5<sup>th</sup> entry reads **Me and Mann digging Holes and pulling Up Roots at Wroth's field.** Most of that month the two of them are working like billy ho.)*
