Air Purifiers

As an additional measure of safety, the Shire of Toodyay has purchased and is installing 5-stage HEPA and UV air purifiers in its staffed public access buildings. This will supplement mask wearing and [reduce the risk of exposure](#) even more for those visiting the Toodyay Library, Toodyay Museum, Visitors Centre, and Admin Buildings. This is a further measure in keeping our residents and visitors safe and our community peace of mind in our shared spaces.

Pulse Oximeters - back in stock


The Shire has received a further 100 pulse oximeters. If you are on the waiting list for one, please pop into the Visitor Centre and pick up your device.

These pulse oximeters are for anyone who meets the criteria as a vulnerable person:

- Over 65;
- Aboriginal people over 50; or
- Pregnant people.

There may not be any more after this supply, so if you require a pulse oximeter, it is first in first served.
