


The Study

The Shire of Toodyay commissioned CATALYSE® to conduct an independent MARKYT® Community Scorecard.

All community members were invited to take part. Scorecard invitations were sent to all households and residential PO Boxes in the Shire of Toodyay using Australia Post's unaddressed mail services. Respondents could complete the scorecard in hard copy or online.

The Shire provided supporting promotions through various communication channels. The scorecard was open from 5 to 30 September 2022.




The scorecard was completed by **520 community members** with various connections to the Shire:







Health and community services

Community Driven Actions

- Lobby State and Federal Government for funding to retain a local medical centre with permanent doctors and associated medical services.
- Provide incentives including housing to help attract and retain medical professionals.
- Attract a wide range of health services including:
 - Dentists
 - · Pathology services
 - Disability services
 - Specialists
 - Physiotherapists, podiatrists and other allied health professionals

Community Voices

"We need a permanent doctor for all young and old in our community."

"As community continues to age, health services are vital for the town i.e. permanent GP and district nurse(s)."

"We really need a decent doctor's surgery that is run properly and adequately funded. The current practice has been announced to close. This is a huge loss for the town and residents. Also, with young family I would much prefer to not have to travel too far for these types of services or have to attend ED when no doctors are available to be seen."

"The loss of a doctor's surgery in town is of extreme concern. The continued support by the Shire of ancillary services currently operating in Toodyay needs to be actively continued. Lobbying by the Shire to Commonwealth and State Government Agencies to support the return of a GP service to Toodyay needs to be strong and ongoing."

"Dedicated housing for medical professionals - currently no shire housing provided."

""A continued Medical Centre facility with doctors AND nurses based in Toodyay five days a week. And if that means providing accommodation or other incentives for them, then so be it."

"Engaging a decent medical practice with doctors who want to live in the community long term and who care about their patients."

"Attract permanent doctors into our communities."

"Permanent GP and associated services e.g. blood testing."

"Need for a local GP practice with other medical services e.g. physio etc."

"Finding a way to attract and support GP services and allied services and pathology, physio, OT."



Community Action Plan

Building and maintaining local roads

Community Driven Actions

1. Maintain roads to a higher standard:

- Repair potholes promptly, especially after heavy rain
- · Repair edges and drains
- · Grade gravel roads more regularly
- Clear trees, vegetation and weeds that obscure visibility
- 2. Ensure repairs are a **long-term solution**, not a temporary fix or "patch".
- 3. Bituminise gravel roads with high traffic volumes.
- 4. Widen narrow, dangerous roads and intersections.

Community Voices

"The roads in the Shire of Toodyay are in a terrible state. They are unsafe at the best of times with large holes and broken edges. Just erecting a sign warning there is a traffic hazard and having it there for 6 months or more is embarrassing for the shire".

"Resurface ageing roads outside town area and grade non-sealed shire roads more regularly. At least fill potholes on old roads as they occur - not with blue metal - properly with hotmix etc."

"There's many gravel roads that require re-sheeting and grading both better and more often."

"The edges of Julimar Rd are terrible and need repair. General maintenance to prevent edge degradation and potholes of all roads in the Shire."

"Maintain roads to a better standard with efficient road drainage."

"Overhanging trees are dangerous especially in storms and intersections have a lot of blind spots from overgrown vegetation."

"Visibility on some street corners is poor due to the height of road verge weeds."

"Roads - repair so that potholes don't keep opening up.

"The roads are damaging vehicles and make it difficult to get around. So many patches that are just not good enough and re-open constantly making bigger more dangerous holes."

"Bitumenising troublesome gravel roads that needs grading every week due to massive increase in traffic."

"Consideration needs to be given to bitumenising Telegraph road. There is a lot of traffic now using these roads and as residents we should not feel endangered when we travel to work either from wet, damaged and ravaged roads or dry slippery pea gravel roads."

Road like Bejoording Rd need to be widened between Sheen Rd and the shire boundary. Clear trees away and widen tarmac. Trucks struggle to pass each other without swiping the bushes on the trees or hitting mirrors. There are many more roads like that which need sorting out."

"Coondle West Rd is narrow and dangerous - widening would help."



Community Action Plan Seniors' services and care

Community Driven Actions

- Advocate for more assisted living-at-home services, affordable seniors housing and aged care facilities
- Attract a wide range of health services including doctors, dentists, podiatrists and physiotherapists.
- Provide more community transport services for seniors.

Community Voices

"Consider encouraging the development of a nursing home so older residents don't have to move out of town when no longer able to look after themselves."

"Toodyay has an ageing population, and yet retirement and care options are very limited. The Shire should focus on and campaign for an aged care facility in town."

"Senior services and care. Provide local medical services and specialists and mental health services and support vital."

"Senior services and care. There are no care homes in the Shire.

The population is ageing and needs to be looked after."

"Ensuring access to health services for older people; supporting accommodation and services for people to age well in their own homes/community."

"Seniors to be able to get to see a doctor in Toodyay in a timely manner.

Appointments are not always available."

"Health care for the elderly...aged care housing is non-existant."

"Local medical services - doctor, podiatry, physiotherapy, massage."

"A permanent medical centre that has regular doctors, not revolving-door ones like we have had."

"Medical care for our aging population."

"Provide a service to and from Northam and Midland for senior's medical appts."

"Not all the elderly can still drive. Some sort of transport assistance for those individuals who are required to attend appointments in places other than Toodyay."

"Again, ensure sufficient public transport is available, as the older we get, the less wecan drive long distances."



Community Action Plan Council's leadership

Community Driven Actions

- 1. Improve community engagement:
 - Inform the community about what is happening.
 - Involve the community in local decision making.
 - Listen and represent the needs of all local groups.
 - Respond to communications; be available.
- 1. Increase accountability for financial decisions.
- Put the needs of the community first there is a perception that some decisions are self-interested.

Community Voices

"Almost non-existent consultation and communication from Council. Find out more from the local papers."

"Leadership: CEO and upper management and any form of public contact. There needs to be better liaison and open communication between management and public.

Try to see the CEO - not possible."

"Council members creating an open dialogue with rate payers, including meetings where locals can OPENLY discuss issues."

"Improve communication, ask ratepayers and listen to their requests."

"The Council and admin need to adhere to their value statements and customer service charters. An automated email to say someone will get back to you within 10 days is not acceptable."

"Get Toodyay out of the headlines touting inadequacies in finance expenditure and maintaining community services."

"Hold those responsible for the extraordinary financial wastage of the Rec Centre, white elephant. Call for accountability."

"Improve Council education ie financial responsibilities and education."

"Council needs to make decisions for the good of the people of Toodyay, not just for money. Don't waste ratepayers' money on cars and clothes for councillors, just one area of wastage."

"Work for the good of the community and not for themselves individually. If they can't put aside their personal wants they should not be there. We don't always agree but be open to both sides of an argument before making a decision."

"Past history reflects the issues related to shire councils and the self-interest issues projected by the individual councillors. A cohesive, forward thinking, well managed, strong strategic plan and community communication are all necessary for a good functioning, community-based shire council. Strong council leadership and attitude is essential for this function."



Community Action Plan Access to public transport

Community Driven Actions

- Lobby for a more frequent train service connecting Toodyay to Midland and Perth.
- Lobby for a bus service between Toodyay and Midland.
- Provide a community shuttle bus service within Toodyay and to Northam for shopping, medical appointments etc.

Community Voices

"Train once daily to Northam or Perth CBD and return - approximately 11 hours between journeys. Hours of travel ok for workers, but very difficult for shoppers or those with medical appointments."

"There is extremely limited transport to Perth and the daily times are set. Be great if the train had two or so earlier trains during the week as an option like 6 am. Weekends are also very limited."

"Lobby State Government for public transport ie replacement of train service at midday or replacement bus service to Midland and Northam so services in Northam and Perth can be accessed."

"Lobbying government for either another train during day or a bus service to compensate to both Northam and Perth. This will be crucial if the medical centre closes. The population has significantly increased since the second train was cancelled."

"Access to public transport. A bus from Toodyay to Midland picking up at certain spots."

"The promised commuter bus, many meetings to discuss the size 12 or 20 seater, didn't eventuate but no explanation offered. Needed by those without cars."

"It would be great if a bus service could operate between Toodyay and Northam for the youth or seniors to be able to get there for goods and services not available here."

> "A regular bus service route in Toodyay and within eg 7 kilometres from town centre for getting into town and Northam."

"As drivers contend with time allowances for travelling over very long distances, keeping in mind safety issues (tiredness, speed, trees, gravel, kangaroos, road bends), and with increased fuel costs for vehicles, and an ageing population of community members, the need for public transport to and from Toodyay will definitely increase."



Sustainable practices / climate change

Community Driven Actions

- Be more environmentally aware leave more vegetation, plant more trees, encourage better verge management, preserve local flora and fauna, and have more rainwater tanks.
- Advocate for greater production and consumption of renewable energy with solar battery grants and solar panels.
- 3. Improve recycling facilities.
- Facilitate greater adoption and use of electric vehicles with more EV charging points.

Community Voices

Develop a long-term strategic plan; where are we now, where do we want to be in the future, what do we need to do to get there. If you don't know where you're going, that's where you'll eventually wind up.

Sustainable practices/climate change. Develop and share with the community - Shire of Toodyay's plans/timeframes for this issue. Be innovative/creative/be leaders.

Preserve and promote the local flora and fauna. Stop decimating the best thing about the area.

A greater focus on sustainable practices and climate change, so that it becomes embedded in the culture rather than bolted on as an afterthought.

Plant trees. Simple. In town centre and elsewhere. Plant more on crown land. STOP cutting them down. Replace fallen or dead trees with another. Stop destroying roadside verges.

Use solar-powered street lights. Businesses should be encouraged to use solar with incentives/grants.

Sustainable practices/climate change. I would like to see solar panels installed on Shire buildings and wherever possible.

Better plastics recycling. Current HDPE and LDPE is too limited.

There are at least 5 varieties of plastic that can be recycled.

Perhaps try to expand the operations of the Recycling Facility to make it a more profitable operation. Extended hours, more concentration on sales etc.

We have an electric vehicle charging station, but there are no signs to show where it is located. Work with the shires of Northam and York and have an Avon Valley Electric Drive with charging stations being set up in Northam and York.

Support EV use - leading by example - all shire vehicles to move to electric.



Conservation and environmental management

Community Driven Actions

- Protect natural bushland and roadside vegetation with tighter development controls.
- 2. Lobby State Government to **protect Julimar State**Forest from mining.
- Lobby Main Roads WA to reduce the amount of clearing required for roadworks.
- 4. Improve management and protection of waterways.
- 5. Implement a **weed management** strategy.

Community Voices

"Save as much of the native bush, especially mature trees as you can. Fight so local voices are heard in regard to road verge clearing especially. Stop using roundup as much as possible — it's too easy a solution and is damaging to us, soil and water. Everything in the environment."

"Continue the positive efforts, work to protect roadside vegetation."

"Preserve, not destroy roadside vegetation and wildflowers."

"Make Julimar Forest a Conservation Park. No mining permission."

"Advocate for the upgrading of Julimar Conservation Reserve to a National Park and prevent impacts from mining to this iconic treasure of the Shire. This would then support the Shire with attracting visitors."

"Destruction of environment for huge road works that lead only to a small village, destroys the reason for tourists to come to the region, the flora along the roads IS the attraction, promote and preserve the beauty of the area."

"Discussions with state government environmental department to tackle Main Roads brutal vegetative clearance when widening Toodyay to Perth road."

"Efforts to maintain and enhance waterways almost non-existent. All water from carparks go into the river, unfiltered. Waterways are managed more by community groups with little to no shire involvement."

"Protection of high value conservation assets. Control of invasive weeds. Education of landholders re clearing, especially road verges. Waterway Management."

"Weeds are taking over everything, especially waterways. Nothing seems to be done about them - even just whipper snipping them back (grasses/cape weed) so they don't go to seed is enough (no chemicals)."



Community Action Plan Youth services and facilities

Community Driven Actions

- Provide safe spaces for young people to meet and socialise.
- Provide a greater range of youth activities.
 Suggestions include movie nights, discos, school
 holiday programs, darts, music, pool, air hockey, day
 trips to Perth etc.
- 3. Provide more **education and training opportunities** for young people.
- 4. Advocate for more **mental health services** for young people.

Community Voices

"Local kids loved going to the CRC on Thursdays after school. It was a chance for them to hang out in a good environment around wonderful, kind, helpful staff.

The place was pretty run down. It would be nice for a new place for them to go to with more room and a nicer space to hang out in."

"There are many youth who seek to leave at 16yrs to escape the boredom. More youth events and activities are needed to assist them to remain home and assist families to provide an avenue of escape for them. This might involve supervised excursions to Perth, youth involvement in their own town development."

"I have a 15-year-old daughter, and there are currently no safe spaces to 'hang out' and no sports/activities in Toodyay for her age group. The CRC previously had an excellent Youth Committee that organised events - youth organising for youth, and she loved that. They had movie nights, school holiday activities and driving courses. Would love to see this back again. Not only does this keep teens out of trouble, it is great for their mental health."

"There needs to be more thought put into youth activities, for there is not a lot for youth to do in Toodyay. The park is very limited."

"A youth area to hang out."

"Move youth centres things to occupy and engage youngsters, especially teenagers."

"A greatly expanded community resource Centre to include more and better pathways to training and employment for school leavers."

"Give the youth of this community something to do...find industry, training and better schooling, as the schooling here is appalling."

"A space for youth and mental health services for them."

"Mental health services locally that cater solely to youth."






