PURPOSE

To provide information on current activities involving the Shire museums and its collections

BACKGROUND

This update follows on from a verbal report presented at the Museum Advisory Committee meeting in November 2018.

OFFICER COMMENT

This report is on current activities – no further actions are recommended

Collections

- Transcriptions
 - o farm diaries from the Newgain property, nearly completed
- Fordson tractor restoration update Clutch plates have been sourced from the USA ready for the clutch to be re-built. In the meantime the accessory drive unit from the gear box was removed due to excessive play and new bearings were installed. (Work on the tractor is only proceeding when Wayne, the Shire Mechanic, does not have more important work to be done with other Shire machinery.)

On site Newcastle Gaol precinct

 1907 Lock-up - Objects being stored in one of the cells at this site have been unpacked, examined and photographed as part of a long term plan to open up the venue for public access. The majority of these items are not a part of the museum collection and their history and how they came

to be stored here is unknown. Many of the objects are in poor or incomplete condition. Efforts are now being made to find out more about these objects by sharing photos on the museum's Facebook page. In the long term, a decision will be made on which items should become a part of the museum collection - after factors such as significance and the current lack of museum storage space is taken into consideration.

- Police Stables disintegrating wooden sleepers used as flooring in the stables have been filled with Level Crete which has been coloured. This will provide a much more level surface for visitors to walk on
- The footbridge behind the gaol has been deemed to be unsafe. In mid-December it was blocked off for foot traffic. We are currently waiting for the sleepers to be replaced, after which the pathway will be re-opened.
- Pruning of trees on the vacant block side of the Gaol was carried out.
 Ensuring clearance for the shingle roof for future works and ongoing maintenance.
- Stephen Carrick Architects have been engaged to prepare the tender for the re-shingling of the Gaol roof. I believe at this stage it is hoped the tender will be awarded by the end of May 2019.

Onsite Connor's Mill

• Milling machinery was serviced in early January. Bearings on all the historic machinery were greased and supports for the electrical motor running the display were tightened, as they had become a bit loose.

Promotion

- Articles about the museum, activities and heritage subjects are included in the monthly Shire newsletter.

Displays

• Preparing for new major temporary exhibition in the Newcastle Gaol. "Taking up the Trail – botanical journeys from Toodyay to Mt Lesueur" will be opening on Saturday 16th February. The exhibition will be exploring the stories of botanical journeys over time to Toodyay, New Norcia and on to Mt Lesueur near Jurien Bay. Themes explored will be Deep Time, European Discovery and the 20th Century and beyond. Significant artefacts from the Benedictine Community of New Norcia collections have been borrowed for the exhibition which will run until the end of July 2019. Working in collaboration with the Toodyay Naturalists Group, Neville Marchant (former director of the State Herbarium) & Marina Baker (former museum collections manager, Benedictine Community of New Norcia)

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Public programs

 Toodyay Historical Society Christmas gathering at the Wicklow Shearing Shed on the evening of Saturday November 25

Points discussed as per report:

- Recent repairs are completed of the footbridge at the Gaol site. A plough from the museum is now a garden ornament at the front of the Police Stables
- Volunteers maintain a presence at the Museum every day.
- Mechanic is slowly working on the tractor with the Shire apprentice and will be returned to working order. A storage space will need to be decided once this is complete.
- Community members and volunteers are enjoying getting involved in the Museum and exhibitions.
