

September 2019 PUBLIC NOTICES

Shire of Toodyay Fire-Break Notice

Pursuant to Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, all residents and ratepayers within the Shire of Toodyay a re required to comply with the requirements set out in this notice.

Due Date: 1 November Annually Maintained Until: 30 April Annually NB: If you purchase land during this period you have 14 days from purchase to comply with this order.

Failure to comply may result in a fines or prosecution

1. All land less than or equal to 1 hectare

- 1.1 All land with an area less than 1 hectare (2.47 acres) are required to be fire hazard reduced by ensuring:
 - grass height does not exceed 100mm; and
 - no tree crowns overhang the building; and
 - ◆ Total available fuel load is maintained at 2 tonnes per hectare or

2. All land greater than 1 hectare

- 2.1 Land up to and including 200 hectares in size shall have a fire-break cleared and maintained within 10 metres of the external boundary.
- 2.2 Land exceeding 200 Hectares in size shall have fire-breaks cleared and maintained so as to divide the property into parcels of land less than 200 hectares.
- 2.3 A fire-break shall be cleared and maintained within 15 metres from external walls of buildings and around haystacks, solar panels and fuel storage areas.
- 2.4 A 20 metre wide Asset Protection Zone (low fuel area) shall be maintained from external walls of buildings and around haystacks, fuel storage areas such that:
 - grass height does not exceed 100mm; and
 - no tree crowns overhang the building; and
 - ◆ Total available fuel load is maintained at 2 tonnes per hectare or
- 2.5 A firebreak shall be cleared and maintained immediately surrounding a

DEFINITION: Fire-break – An area cleared of all inflammable materials 3 metres horizontally (wide) and 4 metres vertically (high).

Additional Restrictions During the Limited Burning Times

Pursuant to Section 24G(2) and Section 25(1a) of the Bush Fires Act 1954 and applicable to all persons, the burning of garden refuse and lighting of camping or cooking fires is prohibited within the Local Government district of Toodyay during the Prohibited Burning Period. Furthermore, pursuant to Section 24G(2) of the Bush Fires Act 1954 and applicable to all persons, the burning of garden refuse is prohibited within the Local Government district of Toodyay during the Restricted Burning Period unless a valid permit to burn has been obtained from a Fire Control Officer. Section 24C (Terms Used) of the Bush Fires Act 1954 contains definitions relevant to this notice.

Work commences on the Duke Street Footbridge

The long awaited repair work on the Duke Street footbridge has commenced.

The bridge repair works scheduled for PTA (Public Transport Authority) to complete is expected to take 3 to 4 weeks (weather permitting).

Further finishing work which will be contracted by the Shire will follow on directly after PTA have completed their section.

Sharing Shire Expertise

The Shire of Toodyay Planning and Development Department has recently made an agreement with the neighbouring shires of Dowerin and Goomalling to provide contract planning, building and health services to them.

Both Dowerin and Goomalling had been using the services of Linton Thomas (a fellow contractor) for many, many years until his retirement at the end of the last financial year.

Our team will be engaged in much the same processes as with Toodyay and will provide advice, statutory and regulatory assessments of applications and also compile agenda items for their respective Council meetings.

It is hoped that we also may be able to assist Dowerin and Goomalling in modernising their regulatory framework through the development and improvement of delegations and policies. This will dovetail nicely with the work that we are doing with Toodyay.

As part of this arrangement, we have already been instrumental in the internationally recognised Dowerin Field Days through the provision of environmental health services and inspections at the event by our Environmental Health Officer.

This arrangement will help strengthen the bond between the Toodyay, Goomalling and Dowerin communities as we are able to share our resources to provide essential professional services to them.

It represents an exciting and challenging opportunity for the team.

Spring has sprung and spring cleaning season is here!

Dispose of your unwanted household chemicals and hazardous materials safely and for free, at a Household Hazardous Waste disposal facility.

You do not need to be a resident of the Local Government managing the site to be able to drop off your paints, flammables, pesticides and batteries. Locate your nearest facility by visiting the WasteNet website.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

There are a number of hazardous chemicals and materials in your home which must not go into any of your kerbside collection bins. If these items are not properly disposed of, they can cause harm to your family, pets or the environment.

Safely dispose of your unwanted household chemicals and hazardous materials at the Toodyay Waste Transfer Station. The Toodyay Waste Transfer Station is open 7 days a week 8.00am to 12 noon.

You do not need to be a resident of the Local Government managing the HHW Faculties to be able to drop off your HHW for free.

ACCEPTED MATERIALS:

- ⇒ Acids and alkalis
- ⇒ Aerosols
- ⇒ Batteries (household)
- ⇒ Engine coolants and glycols
- ⇒ Fire extinguishers Non halon (red) only
- ⇒ Flammables
- \Rightarrow Flares
- ⇒ Fluorescent lamps and tubes (CFLs)
- Gas cylinders (small household)
- ⇒ Household chemicals (e.g. cleaners)
- ⇒ Paint
- ⇒ Pesticides/herbicides
- ⇒ Poisons/toxics
- ⇒ Pool chemicals
- Smoke detectors

Unknown chemicals must be in sealed, chemical resistant containers.

Only domestic waste will be accepted. Limit 20kg or litres per material type.

The first section of the gaol to be re-shingled will be the cell wing. Artefacts from the museum collection will be removed while the display cases will remain in place protected by particle board and protection for the interiors.

Larger objects that can be removed from the cells (such as display panels and the projector in the "Native Cell") will be relocated into a sea container temporarily placed opposite the gaol in the Year of Youth Park for the duration of the restoration. When the re-shingling progresses to the side and front wings of the gaol, then all of the rooms will be emptied, as there are no ceilings in these areas. WHAT'S COUNCIL BEEN UP TO THIS MONTH?

Council met on 27 August 2019 at 4.00pm for their monthly Ordinary Council Meeting.

The public gallery had 14 community members attending and public questions were asked:

- 1. R Madacsi: proposed Advisory Groups Policy and Code of Conduct changes.

Yes, it's *THAT* time of year again!!

Everyone is reminded that the Restricted Burning Period is due to commence on 1 October 2019. Check the Shire website for notices prior to burning, just in case things have changed. If you are wanting to burn during the restricted burning period, you will need a permit which you can get off the Shire's website. Remember that penalties apply for not having a valid permit or breaches of permit conditions. September is a good time to implement hazard reduction on your property. This is your last chance to burn those piles of branches and leaves you have been piling up over winter before the restricted burning and then prohibited seasons start. Summer will be here

before you know it people, so please prepare your properties and save our fire brigades and emergency services from having to visit your property.



Facebook is not the only way you can find out about fire BANS and notifications. Notices are placed on the Shire's website and facebook (which is also shared with the Community Chat, Shire Rangers facebook page and Community Alerts facebook page). The Shire of Toodyay operates a Harvest, Vehicle Movement & Hot Works Ban SMS notification service. You will need to register and once registered for the service, subscribers will be sent SMSs notifying:

- Commencement, or extension and end of a Harvest, Vehicle Movement & Hot Works Ban
- Start, end and any variation to the Restricted and Prohibited are not monitored or responded to. Burning Periods.

The Shire may also use the service to forward **Total Fire Ban notifications from DFES**

The Australian Government is providing \$25 million in Black Spot Funding for road improvements for a number of roads and intersections that have a crash history in the agricultural region. Currently widening and resealing work is taking place on Julimar Road. This work is scheduled for completion in September/October 2019 using \$166,085 of Blackspot funds. Lovers Lane work will consist of widening, reconstruction and sealing as the next scheduled project with an estimated Septem-



ber 2019 start and November/December 2019 completion. This project will use \$264.500 of Blackspot funds.

European House Borer (EHB) In WA Update - August 2019 **EHB** found in roof space!

EHB is a particularly destructive pest of seasoned (dead) pinewood, with the potential to infest structural pinewood in homes across the greater Perth area.

In December 2018, a single female EHB beetle was found inside a roof space in a house near Yanchep. While EHB has been established in parts of the greater Perth area since 2004, this is the first time in WA that EHB has been found inside a roof through natural dispersion. This find confirms that EHB can be attracted into a roof in WA conditions; something not previously known. The house in guestion was about 10 years old with concealed eaves and about half and half H2 treated and untreated roof timbers (H2-treated timber repels EHB). Luckily for the homeowner, no signs of infestation were found upon thorough inspection by experienced pest control operators, although annual inspections are recommended to monitor the situation.

It was a relatively inexperienced pest control operator that recognised and reported this EHB (great job). In the same month we had 3 members of the community find and report EHB on external house walls. We encourage everyone to be vigilant looking for signs of EHB around their own home and yard, particularly during flight season, which runs from September to May, peaking through Decem-

Coondle-Nunile Bushfire Brigade Facility

Construction of the new Coondle-Nunile Bush Fire Brigade Station is now well underway. Funded by the Local Government Grant Scheme, a Watering WA Grant and Shire of Toodyay contributions. the new station will boast modern facilities including a meeting room and offices, drive in drive out design and fire emergency water tanks and backup power.

Completion of this facility is expected late 2019.



DIABETES AUSTRALIA WALK TO WORK DAY FRIDAY 4 OCTOBER

Celebrating its 21st year, Walk to Work Day is being held on Friday 4 October 2019. The annual event, in support of Diabetes Australia, encourages employees and employers to build regular walking into their daily routines.

Toodyay Fun and Fitness Stay Active

Toodyay Fun and Fitness-Stay Active is a community based exercise program for people over 50 years of age. It is coordinated by Wheatbelt Health. To become a member of the group a Medical Clearance form is needed. You can pick up the form on your first visit to the group, but the form will need to be signed by your Doctor before you join in with the

This 16th Festival presents a selection of classical and romantic chamber music for flute and strings, from Mozart to Molique, performed by some of


