#### **RINGA RAILWAY BRIDGE**

Ringa Railway Bridge is a historic bridge located within the Shire along Toodyay Road (neighbouring Coorinja Winery). The bridge is listed in the National Trust and Municipal Inventory and is an eighteen span wooden bridge constructed in 1888. It was the largest wooden bridge in Western Australia at that time and was once part of the State's narrow gauge system.

Recently Council resolved to get a structural assessment of the bridge, not for use but to make it safe for tourists to safely view.

#### **Change of Seasons**

With the end of the Restricted Burning Period officially marking the end of the fire season, permits are now no longer required to burn off.

The Shire of Toodyay would also like to express its gratitude to the vast majority of residents who have heeded fire safety messages making the past season one of the quietest on record. The Shire also extends its thanks to our dedicated Bush Fire Brigade volunteers for their continued efforts. Brigade turnout rates were down around 20% on 2016/2017 figures. Despite this relatively positive news, it remains a concern that around half the fires responded to were either suspicious or involved a level of carelessness.

It is important that we all remain vigilant in respect to suspicious behaviour and that we all continue to take care whenever using fire. Remember - penalties exist for the misuse or negligent use of fire under State and Local Law.

All residents are now encouraged to begin planning and preparing their properties for the next fire season. If burning forms part of your mitigation plan here are a few tips to help you conduct the burn without incident (or false brigade callout):

- Know the weather forecast (BOM Meteye is a great tool for detailed localised forecasts).
- Let your neighbours know.
- Maintain a visible presence at the fire at all times (an attended fire is less likely to be falsely reported).
- Be prepared with adequate fire breaks, equipment and personnel.
- Don't bite off more than you can chew!



## Electric Vehicle Charging Station

The Shire of Toodyay has been successful in receiving a Sustainable Community Grant from the Wheatbelt NRM funded through the Australian Government's National Landcare Programme to install an Electric Vehicle (EV) Charging Station. The idea originally came from a suggestion from a member of the Australian Electric Vehicle Association and the Tesla Owners Club after visiting Toodyay last year, and the opportunity to fund the station came from the NRM's grant program not long after.

The cost of the project is estimated at \$12,891 of which the Shire is contributing \$1,250.


EVE Australia Pty Ltd is supplying the Charging Station equipment which will have two charger points attached to it and will situated in the Charcoal Lane Car park for easy access. One vehicle is estimated to take 60mins to charge and depending upon the car make and model will provide 120km of driving.

The installation of the EV station is helping to establish an 'electric highway' to Toodyay with charging points already installed in Midland and Gidgegannup and another soon to be installed in Merredin.

Although users are required to supply their own charging cable, access, payment and use the station will be wireless through a downloadable smart phone App.

The Council adopted an Environmental Management Strategy in 2015 and the EV charging station compliments this Strategy.

It is anticipated the charging station will be installed in May 2018.

#### **DOG ATTACKS**

Shire Rangers are asking for ALL dog attacks / stock deaths to be reported at the time of the incident, even if it seems like a small incident or you've discussed compensation with your neighbour.

A number of incidents have gone unreported and then a few weeks later another attack occurs of a more serious nature. If the incident had been reported at the time. Rangers would have a documented or reported history which could assist in an investigation if an investigation is required.

If an incident is reported, a Shire Ranger will visit the site as soon as possible, but please keep in mind this may not be immediately as they may be dealing with another issue.

#### Photographs – memory touchstones

There are over 1,350 historic photographs held in the museum collection. We house our photographic prints individually in polypropylene sleeves. Photographs up to A4 size are stored in special archival albums; larger photographs are kept in archival boxes. They are all



located in a separate Archive Room partitioned off from the main object storage area to further reduce the chance of pest infestation and changes in temperature and humidity.

Recently a group of 35 historic photographs were offered to the museum collection by Mary Anderson. She believes they were originally owned by Byron Lloyd. Two of the photos are shown here. While some have inscriptions with limited information there are quite a few that we don't know anything about. #### PROPOSED APPLICATION FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

PROPOSED REACTIVATION OF EXTRACTIVE INDUSTRY - STONE LOT 111 COBBLER POOL ROAD, MORANGUP

The Shire of Toodyay has received an application from BORAL RESOURCES (WA) LTD to reactivate an extractive industry at Lot 111 Cobbler Pool Road in Morangup.

The applicant is seeking approval to remove stone for construction purposes from an area on the property of approximately 6.55 hectares. This area will be extracted in 9 stages. It is expected that up to 500,000 tonnes of stone is to be excavated per year. The anticipated duration of the extraction program is approximately 10 years.

Your views on the proposed extractive industry are encouraged and welcomed. The proposal is available for inspection at the Shire of Toodyay Administration Centre, Old Court House, 15 Fiennes Street, Toodyay, during normal office hours. #### Public consultation now open

The Department, in partnership with local government and industry stakeholders, has today launched a consultation paper outlining a range of different proposals to prevent puppy farms in WA.

Dogs are an important part of many Western Australian families and promoting responsible dog ownership and the future health and welfare of dogs is a key priority for the State Government.

The overbreeding of dogs in WA is evidenced by the number of dogs surrendered to animal shelters and refuges. The RSPCA WA takes in approximately 700 dogs each year.

The proposed options will contribute to a more regulated breeding industry and a reduction in the number of dogs needing rehoming and suffering neglect due to puppy farms.

Community feedback is essential to enable a well informed decision on the impact of the changes across the broader community, industry and government sector.
