

Shire of Toodyay Fire-Break Notice

Pursuant to Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, all residents and ratepayers within the Shire of Toodyay are required to comply with the requirements set out in this notice.

Due Date: 1 November Annually

Maintained Until: 30 April Annually

NB: If you purchase land during this period you have 14 days from purchase to comply with this order.

Failure to comply may result in a fines or prosecution

1. All land less than or equal to 1 hectare

- 1.1 All land with an area less than 1 hectare (2.47 acres) are required to be fire hazard reduced by ensuring:
- ◇ grass height does not exceed 100mm; and
 - ◇ no tree crowns overhang the building; and
 - ◇ total available fuel load is maintained at 2 tonnes per hectare or lower.

2. All land greater than 1 hectare

- 2.1 Land up to and including 200 hectares in size shall have a fire-break cleared and maintained within 10 metres of the external boundary.
- 2.2 Land exceeding 200 Hectares in size shall have fire-breaks cleared and maintained so as to divide the property into parcels of land less than 200 hectares.
- 2.3 A fire-break shall be cleared and maintained within 15 metres from external walls of buildings and around haystacks, solar panels and fuel storage areas.
- 2.4 A 20 metre wide Asset Protection Zone (low fuel area) shall be maintained from external walls of buildings and around haystacks, fuel storage areas such that:
- ◇ grass height does not exceed 100mm; and
 - ◇ no tree crowns overhang the building; and
 - ◇ total available fuel load is maintained at 2 tonnes per hectare or lower.
- 2.5 A fire-break shall be cleared and maintained immediately surrounding a stationary motor.

DEFINITION: Fire-break – An area cleared of all inflammable materials 3 metres horizontally (wide) and 4 metres vertically (high).

In addition to fulfilling all of his duties to a very high standard as a ranger, Chris, with the endorsement of the Shire, has dedicated time and effort in established a working in partnership with TAFE Northam and our local District High School to provide mentoring, work experience and practical placement activities of TAFE students. The value of which is immeasurable and wholly supported by the Shire. Chris is also available to them once they complete their studies and is never too busy to help those who seek him out.



Chris understands that to create excellent rangers for the future, you have to give back where it matters most – investing in the development and support of the next wave of aspiring officers who want to take on this as a career. Restricted and Prohibited Burning Periods

The **Restricted Burning Period** runs in two parts, the first from 1 October to 31 October annually and the second part from 9 March to 30 April annually. During the Restricted Burning Periods, a permit (see below) is required from the Shire before any burning operations can be carried out.

The **Prohibited Burning Period** runs from 1 November to 8 March annually. No burning is allowed for any reason during this period. This includes open cooking or camping fires or the burning of rubbish and garden refuse.

Residents should note that the Restricted and Prohibited Burning Periods may be extended due to unseasonal weather conditions. These will be advertised in newspapers and through the Shire's SMS Harvest, Vehicle Movement & Hot Works Ban SMS notification service, but if in doubt please contact the Shire of Toodyay.

Failing to comply with the Restricted and Prohibited burning period can result in fines or prosecution.

Permits During the Restricted Burning Period, a permit must first be obtained from the Shire. Permits will only be issued for legitimate mitigation outcome or in primary producer requirements. Permits will not be issued for social occasions or burning of rubbish.

If granted, all conditions on the permits must be strictly adhered to.

During the second (Autumn) portion of the Restricted Burning Period, preference will be given to primary producers for crop preparation purposes.

Burning Road Verges A permit is required to burn the road verge. Permits will only be issued between May and August each year

where no alternative exists to mitigate the hazard.

All permits are automatically void on:

- Sundays
- days of Very High, Severe, Extreme or Catastrophic fire danger
- days of Total Fire Bans

To apply for a permit please complete the Online Application Form which can be found on the Shire's website:

To complete the form you will be required to supply the following details:

- Your Full Name
- Your Residential Address
- Location (Address and/or Parcel) of the burn.
- Phone Number(s)
- UHF Channel (if available)
- Type of burn (i.e. Stubble, grass, bush)
- Preferred Permit Commencement Date

The Shire will endeavour to respond to permit requests by COB the day following the request application.

To assist processing your request, when providing parcel descriptions please provide the full and current details (i.e. Lot and Plan Number). Quoting superseded or incomplete parcel descriptions may delay your request as the Shire uses current Landgate data to verify locations. Landgate have a map viewer to assist the public in confirming addresses or lot details.



Portable pool safety requirements Building and Energy are issuing a timely reminder to ensure children's safety around pools and spas this summer.

Young children can drown in portable pools in a matter of seconds if unsupervised. Any pool that is designed for swimming, wading and paddling that contains water more than 30cm deep, must be enclosed by an effective safety barrier that complies with the laws. A summarised checklist is now available as a guide for pool owners:
